

## **New scheme launched to assist survivors of institutional abuse in Ireland**

*January 16<sup>th</sup> 2014*

A new scheme has been launched to assist people who, as children, experienced abuse in institutions in Ireland and who received awards through the Residential Institutions Redress Board or Irish courts. It will be managed by a statutory body established under the Residential Institutions Statutory Fund Act, 2012, called Caranua, and is supported by a fund of €110 million committed by Irish religious congregations.

The overall aim of the scheme is to bring about improvements in the living conditions and well being of eligible survivors. Caranua will provide a dedicated information and advice service to eligible survivors, will work with public bodies to ensure that survivors have their statutory entitlements and will fund the provision of additional health, housing and education services, based on successful applications from survivors.

There are 15,000 people potentially eligible to benefit from Caranua, of that 8,500 are in Ireland, 5,000 are in the United Kingdom and the remainder live in other parts of the world, mainly in Canada, Australia and the United States.
